"**Black Box** has a really cool brand mix: Ksubi, Bassike, Garrett Leight, Stolen Girlfriends Club, and more. The decor is quite industrial, with lots of concrete and steel. It's definitely worth a visit."

"**Fabric** is one of the best new stores in the Britomart precinct. They carry higher-end stuff like Comme des Garçons, Gosha, and Isabel Marant. I bought a beautiful Dior Homme jacket there a few years ago that had me sweating at the time of purchase. It was an investment piece."

"**Tango** is my favorite vintage store in New Zealand. You never know what you're going to discover, and you won't see the things they sell on anyone else. I bought a pair of pointed loafers, almost like winklepickers [sharp-toed boots made popular in Britain in the 1950s]. They are so dope!"
